

CHC33021 Certificate III in Individual Support (Ageing & Disability)



The qualification CHC33021 Certificate III in Individual Support (Ageing and Disability streams) is intended for those who are currently working in Health Support roles and wish to quickly gain professional recognition of their skills and knowledge, or alternatively those who wish to enter the profession with the necessary skills and knowledge to accept a professional level of responsibility.

The course consists of thirteen (15) units of competency comprising of a minimum of nine (9) core and, and six (6) elective units from the CHC Training Package (Release 8).

QualityCare Training Institute has developed a program that meets the requirements of the qualification, as shown below. Alternative combinations of units of competency are possible within the rules of the training package; potential participants wishing to discuss alternative units should contact QualityCare Training Institute's office.

The qualification is nationally recognised and can only be delivered by a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) that complies with the governing standards of quality control and quality training and assessment.

Upon successful completion of the course assessments, you will be awarded a:

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Participants who exit the training program without completing all assessments will be issued with a statement of attainment for those units in which they have demonstrated competency.

The qualification process also recognises your existing skills and knowledge. Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is a process where the participants existing skills and knowledge are matched against the requirements of the qualification. If the participant is assessed as already having achieved competency the course is reduced in duration. Additional information on our RPL process is available from our Administration Office.

Participants in this job role are often required to physically assist people in their care, accordingly, participants need to be physically able. Participants with any concerns over their physical capability should contact our Operations Manager.

Participants also need to be aware that an Australian Federal Police clearance is required before participants can participate in the clinical sessions, this clearance is also required for working in this industry. Additionally, a clearance from NDIS is expected by all Aged Care homes for clinical work placement.

The format for delivery/assessment is based on a eight (8) weeks classroom training program comprising of two sessions per week of 8 hrs duration, and 3 weeks of 40 hours per week (A total of 120 hours) in Clinical Work Placement. Initially the course will be delivered in two sessions on Saturdays and Sundays every week. However, should demand indicate alternative delivery arrangements, these may be offered.

A link to online study material will be provided for self-study of all Units. **It is expected from all students that they will read through Unit's Learning Guide before attending class of that Unit.**

Assessment will take place for each of the units studied at the end of theory classes and clinical work placement period. The Certificate of the qualification will be issued once student found competent in all aspects of eligibility. A maximum of 6 months is allowed to complete qualification from the time of enrolment.

To be eligible to enrol in our training programs participants must be able to read and write English to a sufficient standard to work with the supplied texts. A Language and Numeracy assessment is required as pre-enrolment requisite. Participants in our courses also need to be at least 18 years of age, proof of age will be required at time of enrolment.

Fees and Charges: The course fee is **\$2,500**, payable in two instalments and it includes all assessment booklets.

Payment Schedule is:

\$1,200.00 First deposit payment at the time of enrolment
\$1,300.00 During 4th-5th week of classes
